Ryanair's Madrid Training Centre: €100m Investment Creates 150 Jobs The Irish low-cost airline Ryanair has chosen Madrid as the location for its new training centre, investing €100 million in the project. The centre will have space to train up to 250 pilots and cabin crew members daily, using six Boeing 737 flight simulators. In addition to the training centre, Ryanair announced four new routes from Madrid for winter 2023/24: Aqaba, Essaouira, Liverpool, and Treviso. Fifteen existing routes will see increased frequencies, including Amman, Birmingham, Krakow, Prague, and Rome. Ryanair's CEO, Eddie Wilson, said in Madrid that the new training centre would create 150 local jobs and provide aspiring aviation professionals with access to state-of-the-art facilities and world-leading training.
