While plucking strawberries and savouring scones with teas are the usual activities in every visitors to do list, you should also visit the Time Tunnel to learn more about the background and history of Cameron Highlands. How to get there By car, the journey to Cameron Highlands takes about three hours from Kuala Lumpur. The trip will take you for an approximately 2.5km-long ride, weaving through a tea plantation and hitting designated lookout points where you can stop and snap photos of the lush greenery. For an additional RM10, you can get on a swing to experience dangling in the air with the surrounding valleys as your backdrop. Adventurous individuals can also opt to ride solo on a single ATV (RM80/pax), or pair up for a double ATV (RM90) combo. Jeep And ATV Service Vehicles are not in amazing shape but good enough for the short 30-minute ride. The guide will show you how to start and drive the ATV (there is no practice run). Safety seems to be taken too seriously. But you do get helmets! And the speed doesn't get higher than 50 km/h. Hiking is a fantastic way to get a real feel of the environment and natural surroundings. This does mean going through a moist jungle on hilly terrain. So, havesolid hiking shoes and ample drinking water. A poncho or umbrella and a light sweater/jacket will come in handy! Undergrowth At Coral Hill The app.Maps.meoffline maps) can also be a lifesaver if you lose signal on your phone during the trail! We don't recommend going solo as people have gotten lost before. End Of The Forest As an alternative to the Mossy Forest, we recommend Coral Hill. This hill is short, and free to enter. But once you do get to the top, be very careful as it is an exposed rocky outcrop. Other hiking trails you might want to check out. The top of Gunung Brinchang is home to a well-known mossy forest. See the dedicated post on the Mossy Forest of Brinchang if you want to know more! A prominent part of Cameron Highlands beautiful, lush mountains are the waterfalls! Robinson Falls is just outside of Tanah Rata. If you want to drive to this waterfall, head in the direction of the Cameron Highlands Hospital. And about 500m before reaching the hospital, take the road on the right with a huge billboard and a small sign for Robinson Waterfall. Robinson Falls, Cameron Highlands Photo by Travelswithsun Turn into this road for about 100m. There should second billboard and a concrete bridge made with colorful tires! Follow the bridge in and you will presently see the waterfall in less than 1 km. If you're up for a hike, you can also access Robinson Falls via Trail No.9 where the starting point is MARDI. Note: Waterfalls in Cameron Highlands are often victims of litterbugs. Don't expect them to look pristine. Read more about the waterfalls of Cameron Highlands. Especially during public holidays and weekends. This is a happening place to be at night. There are coffee franchises like Starbucks. And the mall has an open-air hall with clocktower and other decorations. It almost has a Christmas-like atmosphere. Clock Tower At Cameron Centrum, Brinchang Downstairs is a supermarket (Billion Supermarket) too. Local supermarkets can be a great place to discover local snacks and fruit. Know what you want to do before you go! This will save you a lot of time from going through traffic which is a real timewaster. Do not underestimate how popular Cameron Highlands is with the local crowds. See some examples and suggestions on how to come up with your own itinerary for Cameron Highlands. For most first-time visitors, we recommend a visit to at least one tea plantation, a strawberry farm and a flower park. While planning your trip, consider when the best time to visit Cameron Highlands is. Even at its highest altitude, there are time when it's not that much cooler in the highlands than the mainland. Furthermore, you might want to skip the rainy season to avoid risks of landslides. With a land area encompassing 71,000 hectares within the cool and pristine natural air, Cameron Highlands is one of the top tourist destinations in Malaysia. There are so much you can do here, you
