DIY ATV Gun Rack A quick fix for storing firearms was installing a gun rack in the vehicle - it's sturdy and holds plenty of weight without getting damaged from dirt roads and gravel. #17 DIY Truck Gun Rack Installing a gun rack in your truck is a no-brainer, as it keeps guns safe from scratches and damage when not in use. It also helps protect them during long trips and hunting excursions by keeping them dust-free and secure. How to make a DIY Gun Rack Gather these materials: Plywood Saw Hammer Nails Level Tape measure Rifle or shotgun Steps to make a DIY vertical gun rack 1) Decide on the size of the rack The rack needs to be tall enough for your gun's length, plus some extra space. It should also match the width of the gun. To avoid any stability issues, it's best if the rack is narrower than the gun by a couple of inches. 2) Cut the plywood Use a saw to cut a piece of plywood to the desired size and make sure it has a 1-inch wide slot running down its center. 3) Assemble and nail Attach another piece of wood at a right angle to the bottom edge using nails and a hammer. This will give you two long pieces with slots, along with two vertical pieces attached perpendicularly on either side. 4) Drill extra holes Drill a hole near one end in the top piece, wide enough for a screw or nail that'll attach it to a wall stud without weakening the plywood. Similarly, drill another hole in the bottom piece. 5) Attach and tighten Screw or nail the top and bottom pieces into place in their respective drilled holes, making sure the screws or nails don't protrude through the wood where they could cause injury. 6) Attach to a wall Finally, attach both pieces of plywood to a stud in the wall using long screws with flat heads that won't be too cumbersome for you or your guests when accessing the guns. 7) Add a lock If desired, attach a padlock to the front of the rack to prevent unauthorized access during parties and gatherings. 8) Clean up Use a rag and cleaning solution to wipe down both sides of the plywood as well as all assembled pieces. Let it dry completely before use and remember to clean your guns regularly (especially on bumpy dirt roads). The rack is an ideal storage solution for guns. Unlike horizontal gun racks, vertical storage prevents damage by not requiring you to pull the gun out at an angle or remove it completely to access the one behind it. This protects delicate rifle stocks from being marred by leaning against each other, which can lead to cracks and chips over time. Vertical storage also reduces wear on guns caused by contact with other guns, as their barrels are not rubbing against each other. Furthermore, vertical gun storage is harder for thieves to access, making it more difficult for them to steal your guns. It also prevents others from touching your guns, decreasing accidental shootings and other accidents. However, vertical gun racks can be costly due to the thicker wood and additional materials used in their construction, which may make them heavier and more difficult to move around. Additionally, they are prone to wobble and instability, as well as leaving marks and dents on rifle stocks, especially in humid or temperature-changing environments. Lastly, vertical gun racks take up more space than horizontal ones, both on the wall and on the floor.
