ETS which stands for Electric Train Service is an inter-city rail service operated by the Malaysian national railway operator Keretapi Tanah Melayu Berhad. It is the fastest metre gauge train service in Malaysia that currently operates along the electrified and double-tracked stretch of the West Coast Line between Gemas and Padang Besar on the Malaysia-Thai border. The ETS train schedule in Malaysia can be categorized into the Gemas – Padang Besar and Padang Besar – Gemas routes. The trains travel up to 140 km/h (87 mph) on an electrified metre gauge rail line. Therefore, the ETS can be classified as a Higher Speed Rail train service. However these services use the 1,067mm (3 ft 6 in) gauge. In view of this, it is possible that the KTM ETS service is the only inter-city rail line recorded in the world using 1,000 mm 3 ft 3 3⁄8 in) metre gauge at the maximum speed of 140 km/h. Completed in 1910 to replace an older station on the same site, the station was Kuala Lumpur's railway hub in the city for the Federated Malay States Railways and Malayan Railway, before Kuala Lumpur Sentral assumed much of its role in 2001. The Station is notable for its architecture, adopting a mixture of Eastern and Western designs. The Station is located along a road named Jalan Sultan Hishamuddin, previously known as Victory Avenue, which in turn was part of Jalan Damansara. The Station is located closely to the similarly designed Railway Administration Building, as well as the National Mosque and Dayabumi Complex. When KTM Komuter services were launched in 1995 to serve the Seremban Line and the Port Klang Line, ticket counters and fare gates were added to the Station, in common with other KTM Komuter stations. The location of Komuter facilities meant that only the newer island platform could be used by KTM Komuter trains. After Kuala Lumpur Sentral assumed the responsibility of receiving intercity operations, portions of station facilities designated for intercity services were decommissioned or removed. After renovations to the old sections of platform 2 and 3, the Komuter trains now stop within the original section of the station with the platform heights being raised to meet the floor level of the trains. Interchange Station The Kuala Lumpur KTM Komuter Station is designated in official transit maps as an interchange station with the RapidKL LRT Kelana Jaya Line's Pasar Seni LRT Station and MRT Kajang Line's Pasar Seni MRT Station. It is notable for its architecture, adopting a mixture of Eastern and Western designs and presenting a mixture of Western and Mughal similar to Moorish Revival or Indo-Saracenic architecture. The Pasar Seni LRT station and Pasar Seni MRT station are located 400 metres away, accessible through the pedestrian walkway above the Klang river. Completed in 1910 and undergone major renovations in 1986 and 1995, the Kuala Lumpur KTM station now contains three platforms serving four railway tracks. The station consisting of two side platforms - platforms 1 and 4 - on both sides and one island platform - platforms 2 and 3 - in between.
