Limitations It's possible that you can run the lock access code any app on your phone except for the application of the phone. It's not possible to disable access the phone application. For apps like *Messages* or *FaceTime*, you need to change the "Always allowed" the *TIME* screen to remove them to the limit to be enabled. You can disable access to messages and *FaceTime*, but you may not want. When access to the messages is disabled by the limits of apps, devices using *iCloud* to screen time are not able to send or receive messages during downtime. Make sure the screen is enabled and time is set a passcode. Select "Limit app". Tap "Add limit". Select "All apps and categories". Choose a short period of time from the interface of the timer, for example, a minute or two. Tap "Add". Choose "All apps and categories" block all apps on your iPhone except for some. You can narrow that down a bit by selecting only one category of applications to block, such as "Social Networking", and you can unlock individual applications by going to "Always allow" on the main screen time, by selecting "All applications & Categories" and clearing, the app that you want to make accessible.
