Successful completion of an Advanced Placement Spanish Language class is also a strong credential for demonstrating your language proficiency during the admissions process. The AP Spanish Language and Culture exam takes just over three hours to complete. The test has listening, reading, and writing components. Section I of the exam is made up of 65 multiple choice questions and counts for 50% of the total exam score. This section has two parts: Part A asks students to answer questions related to Spanish language sources drawn from literature, ads, maps, tables, letters, and newspapers. Part B of the exam focuses on a combination of listening and reading. Students will answer questions after listening to audio texts drawn from sources such as interviews, podcasts and conversations. Section II of the exam focuses on writing. Students must perform four tasks: Task 1 asks students to read and respond to an email message. For Task 2, students write a persuasive essay that integrates three source documents (an article, a table or graphic, and an audio text). Task 3 requires students to preview a conversation and then answer five questions related to the conversation. The final task involves presentation speaking in which students compare cultural features of their own community with those found in an area of the Spanish-speaking world. In 2018, over 180,435 students took the exam and those test-takers earned a mean score of 3.69. AP exams are scored using a 5-point scale.
