1.6K We all have been in a situation where each time we enter lengthy text in Microsoft Excel or Google Sheets, it either overflows toward the adjacent cell (s) or gets cut off at the cell border. This makes it harder to present your information clearly and comprehensively. To address this issue, we have come up with numerous methods that will help you wrap the text in Excel and Google Sheets. Wrapping text allows you to display long or multi-line text within a single cell, making it easier to read. As you can see from the below screenshot, when the data input inside the cell is larger, it spills over to neighboring cells and also gets trimmed. Whereas, when we use the wrap text feature, it fully displays the text in a cell. But the question is, why would you need the Wrap Text tool when you can simply widen the column? Well, the thing is, when you work on a large worksheet with a lot of data, it becomes harder to maintain readability and a clear overview of the information. In such a scenario, wrapping the text is an optimal solution. If you are an Excel user, you will glad to hear that there are many ways to wrap text in Excel, simply select the cell (s) and press Alt + H + W from your keyboard. In the middle of the Ribbon, you will find an option named Wrap Text. Simply click on it, and it will wrap the text in the cell. The problem with automatic wrapping is that you dont get control over the line breaks, and this can often make your workbook look messy or poorly formatted. Thus, manually wrapping text allows you to control where line breaks occur in a more precise manner. To add a line break, just press the Alt + Enter from your keyboard and it will auto-adjust the row height. Tip: Learn how to export Android contacts to Excel. The above methods would be more than enough for you. However, if you are interested in learning another trick for wrapping text in Excel, follow the guide below: 1. Open the Excel file and press Ctrl + 1 to open Format Cells. 2. From there, go to the Alignment tab and check the box next to the Wrap text. 3. After that, hit the OK button and your text will be wrapped inside the cell. If your text isn't automatically wrapping, its possible that the row height has been manually adjusted by you or someone else. In that case, you can just click on the Format button (under the Home tab) and select the AutoFit Row Height option. If you don't want to double-click a cell to see its contents, here's how to use the wrap text feature. By default, whenever a cell contains more characters than physical appearance, instead of spilling over onto the next line, extra characters are hidden from sight. To show all the text contained in a single cell, we'll use the wrap text feature to format and see the entirety of the cell. Fire up your browser, head to the Google Sheets home page, and open a new or existing spreadsheet. Click on an empty cell and then type text. Make sure to enter enough characters for Google Sheets to automatically hide the excess. If you open a spreadsheet that already contains data, you can select the cell(s) where you want to apply text wrap format. Next, click Format > Text Wrapping and then click on the "Wrap" option to format the cell. Afterward, the cells you selected to format no longer hide the remaining characters inside the cell. Now, the characters wrap to a new line within the containing cell. That's all there is to it. Whenever you need to show all the data inside a cell in a instant, you can use the wrap text formatting feature to accomplish it easily. When you have a long sentence or long strings in a cell in the Google Sheets app, you will find that it overflows to the adjacent cells on the right (like below).
