I set my regulator to 35lbs of pressure. Makes the best bubbly water. Alternatively you can refill the stock cannisters with dry ice to make CO2, you just have to be careful not too put too much dry ice in, otherwise you'll blow out the safety valve and possibly damage your machine. (There's one story where one guy blew the top off his machine and also right through one of his cabinets in the kitchen!) Lots of videos on YouTube on how to refill like this. The large tanks aren't without hazards either though--if you go that route you should secure the tank to the wall to avoid knocking it over accidentally. As Mythbusters proved, a full CO2 tank that has its valve busted off has enough force to rocket away and go right through a brick wall! Definitely not something you want to have happen in your house. I don't have a SS machine, but I looked into it when that one was on sale back around Father's Day time..just to see what the costs would be, etc. Since I never bought one I guess the research was a big waste of time, haha, but at least now I'm sharing it here.
