including to the American Cancer Society, lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer death among both men and women. Each year, more people die of lung cancer than from colon, breast, and prostate cancers combined. An annual test for lung cancer intended for long-term smokers is now being recommended by major medical organizations, including the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force. Low-dose CT, offered by Deaconess Hospital, can help detect lung cancer at its earliest, most-treatable stages. Low-dose CT is a lung cancer screening option available to higher-risk patients that utilizes much lower radiation than a typical CT scan—up to 70-90% less—and can find lung cancer in early, more-treatable stages. To be eligible for the screening, you must have the following risk factors:

- Be between the ages of 55-74
- Have a 30 pack-year history or more (details below)
- Be currently smoking or have smoked within the last 15 years

All three criteria must be met for this testing. Because the test does involve some radiation, the risk for lung cancer must be higher than the overall lifetime radiation risk. The "pack-year history" is determined by calculating how many packs of cigarettes per day have been smoked what number of years. For example, if an individual started smoking at age 20, and smoked a pack a day until age 50, that would be 30 pack years. If that same person had smoked one pack a day, 30 pack years would also apply. There may be a good reason to get tested even if you are younger than 55. For example, if you are 48 and have smoked 60 packs of cigarettes, you would still qualify for the test. The test takes place at the Deaconess Hospital at 600 Maryland Street in Evansville, Indiana. During your appointment will last less than 30 minutes. The results are immediately reviewed by a board certified radiologist, and are also presented to the Deaconess Multidisciplinary Lung Nodule Review Board where each patient's scan and history is individually reviewed. The patient is then handled with results and recommendations, and both the patient and their primary care physician will receive copies of the results. Many insurance companies currently pay for the screenings, and more are expected to do so soon. Staff at the Chancellor Center will work with individuals' insurance companies to determine coverage, and handle billing. If someone wants this test and is a good candidate, and their insurance doesn't cover the test, we will work with patients on affordable payment options. We want this life-saving service to be available to as many people as possible.

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Based in Houston, the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center is No. 1 in the 2016 U.S. News & World Report list of best hospitals for cancer care, and it is routinely first or second on that list. Deaconess will be the 16th local health care provider to join MD Anderson's chain of local providers. The affiliation will mean doctors will have access to the most current research and treatment information, and second opinions about tough cases, according to Deaconess officials. "This is all about better patient care," was very similar to our philosophy and mission," CEO Linda White said. Deaconess had been pursuing the MD Anderson affiliation about three years ago. Officials likened the process to being audited. The process included MD Anderson visits to Deaconess facilities. "There was a philosophy and vision of patient care that was different from ours, but we were able to understand it," she said. "We continued to explore, and it was an exploration with Deaconess and us looking at each other. We did an extensive review of a lot of things. It's a great investment for the community, and it's really about the quality and aspects of the medical services that we're trying to establish here." Deaconess is part of the national network of hospitals affiliated with MD Anderson. The MD Anderson affiliation will give Deaconess oncology doctors and staff regular, easy access to experts in breast cancer, leukemia and other forms of cancer. "There's not a better institution continuing education for physicians and access for opinions," said Dr. Chris Braden, chairman of the Deaconess Oncology Committee. "We can keep up to date on the most cutting edge research, and if you have a challenging case – the patient comes in and there's some question about how you would handle that case – we can summarize the information, send it to them and they will expedite a second opinion." It's good for the physician but it's better for the patient," Braden said. MD Anderson spent about \$780 million on cancer research in 2015. Because of its national reputation, MD Anderson's services are in demand – the provider deals with 130,000 cases a year – and the affiliate network enables MD Anderson to touch more patients, according to officials. MD Anderson's goal is to grow the network to about 30 providers. Before Deaconess joined, the nearest MD Anderson Cancer Network provider was Community Health Network in Indianapolis.
