The Catholic Bible is called this because it was originally prepared by Catholic leaders, scholars, and theologians. Altogether, there are 7 more books in the Catholic Bible than that of the Protestant Bibles. The 7 extra books are called Deuterocanonical or Apocrypha. The word Apocrypha means hidden. (The word Apocrypha is from Greek: apokryphos, meaning hidden or obscure.) The Catholic Bible has 66 books of the Protestant Old and New Testament plus 7 more books, a total of 73 books in all. The 7 books are Tobit, Judith, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach (also known as Ecclesiasticus), Baruch. In addition, the Books of Esther and Daniel are slightly different.
