Satsang Examinations have been playing a fundamental role in enriching and enlightening thousands of devotees, young and old, with the knowledge of Vedic, cultural and Satsang values. Satsang Examinations were the dream of Yoggiji Maharaj, which started with 56 centers at its inception in 1972 and today has multiplied to 1600 centers in India and abroad. In the March 2022 Satsang Exams, 14,101 examinees appeared for these exams out of which 4,817 examinees passed. The overall result is 34.16%. To find out your result, Log in to your account and Click the “Result” button. Is on-line registration available for those residing in India? The current more traditional in-person registration system is able to accommodate those from both small towns as well those in the city and remains to be highly effective. For this reason registration in India remains in paper-form. Satsang Exam e-Registration (SEeR) is currently active for foreign countries only. What information do I need, before I complete online registration? Since you can create permanent online accounts in your lifetime, be honest and complete all the details accurately. Recall your memory to check if you ever appeared or registered for Satsang Exam in your lifetime. If you have registered, then provide: Approximate year of exam, exam center, country, last exam name, and permanent six digit seat number (if you know). Did you use different name at the time of last exam? If yes, then please specify (for married female, provide full name before marriage); first name, full middle name, and last name. Make sure your contact information: e-mail ID is valid and phone number is correct. Once you submit registration form, your local exam coordinator will contact you to verify the data for initial activation and further approval. I am not computer savvy and I do not have e-mail ID. How can I register for Satsang Exam? You can contact your local Satsang Exam Coordinator. He/she can create your Secondary account without e-mail ID. Provide accurate personal information at the time of creating online account. Once your account is processed, you will be able to log in to your account and access all information. However you will not be able to receive auto notifications from the system. When does registration start? When does it close? Generally registration begins on the day result is declared which is May 15th. Registration closing date is October 1st for first time examinees who are registering in SEeR system for the first time. For existing examinees who have SEeR accounts in the system, closing date is November 1st. How do I register for next exam? Sign in to your account on . Click on “REGISTER FOR EXAM” button highlighted in red line. Select appropriate Language, center and credit card information and submit. If you passed or registered for satsang exam before 2010 then you will have to create a new OTIS profile in SEeR database. Contact your local exam coordinator if you need help. When is the closing date for Language change, Center change and Pragna Paper change? November 15th is the closing date for such changes. Confirm your exam details in your login account like: Exam level, language, center change request, Pragna exam first paper or second paper or both papers before November 15th. This is the last day to make all kind of exam detail changes. After November 15th records will be merged for Final List and Exam Division start printing barcoded top sheets for all examinees. Hence it is not possible to change any exam details after November 15th. What do I do if I want to change my exam center? Sign in to your account on . Click on “Envelop” icon, then click on “Create New Request”. From drop down menu select “Exam Center Change” and in the comment box write down the name of center you want to change. Make sure you update your contact information including your new home address and phone number in your profile unless it is a temporary exam center change. Contact your exam coordinator. He/she can also help you out. I am in UK-Europe global network, can I pay my exam fees using PayPal without a PayPal account? Yes! It is commonly misunderstood that a PayPal account is needed in order to make payments through PayPal. The truth is you DO NOT need one. Without a PayPal account, all you need is any Credit card which is supported by PayPal. By using PayPal, we can process your registration. PayPal is the easiest and most secure way to make payment online. No account needed. After making credit card payment you can also check the status of your registration on “REGISTER FOR EXAM” page in your account. What are the protocols for Pragna exams registrations and grading policy? Examinees, as per their choice can register for both the Question Papers in the same year or register for the 1st paper in the first and the 2nd paper in the following year for any of the Pragna Exams. One can only register for the 2nd paper after passing the 1st Paper. Examinees opting to register for only one of the two papers for any of the Pragna examinations must score 45 Marks to pass. Examinee should make his/her choice while registration. Pragna examinee can choose paper 1 or both papers. Select accordingly when registering for exams. Examinees who have registered for both papers of Satsang Pragna Exam should appear for both papers. Presence in only one paper will not be considered valid. Examinees who appear for both papers in the same year must score a combined minimum of 90 Marks to pass. After passing the 1st paper, one can postpone appearing for the 2nd paper for a maximum of 1 Year. If two examinees are eligible for a prize then the one who has appeared for both exams together will be rewarded with 10% marks and thus become eligible to get the prize. Sep2011126 TARDINESS: The examinee is expected to take Paper 1 and Paper 2 (if applicable) exam at the scheduled times. If the examinee is more than 15 minutes late for the exam, he/she will not be admitted to take the exam. If the examinee is less than 15 minutes late, he/she can take the exam but will not receive any additional time to finish. All exams will end at the same time. EXAM LOCATION: Exams taken at unauthorized locations or in which the exam rules have been violated will not be considered valid. Candidates who wish to change the center at which they will sit for the Final Exam must inform and take prior permission from the Satsang Exam Division in India. WRITING UTENSILS: Examinee will write their answers with either a blue or black pen only. Answers written in pencil or with any other colored pen will not be considered valid. Answers written in more than one colored ink will also not be considered valid. Answers written on additional paper will not be considered valid. ANSWERING QUESTIONS: All examinees are requested to write clearly, legibly and must pay close attention to all the instructions given. Answers crossed out will not be considered valid. Do not write your name anywhere in or on the answer book. Do not in any way damage the bar code printed on the front page. Answer papers with more than one type of handwriting will not be accepted. VALIDATION: Satsang Exam is only valid for use by the examinee identified on the top sheet, and only at the designated center in the specified medium (Gujarati, Hindi, English) and for the exam level (e.g. Prarambha, Pravesh, Parichay, etc.) indicated. Any difference will not be considered valid. ATTENDANCE: Candidates who have registered for both papers of Satsang Pragna Exam, Satsang Pravesh, Parichay and Pravin exams need to give both papers. Presence in only one paper will not be considered valid. MEDIUM LEVEL: The medium (Gujarati, English, Hindi) and the exam level in which candidates take the Pre-Test (upload in the examinee's login account on 1st December) will be the medium in which they must take the Final Exam. Answer books bearing details of candidates different from the Final ‘PDF’ List will not be accepted for marking. REQUIRED SIGNATURE: On the day of the Final Satsang Examinations, all examinees should obtain the signature of the class supervisor on the top sheet of answer book bearing their own personal details only. Answer books without the signature of the Class Supervisor will not be considered valid. SUBSTITUTE WRITER: Without the prior permission from the Exam Division in India, answer papers written by substitute writers in place of the original examinee will not be accepted. ELECTRONIC DEVICES: All electronic devices including cell phones and laptops are to be turned off and put away as they are not permitted in the Exam Center. DISHONESTY: Any examinee suspected of/or caught cheating (including using unauthorized materials during the exam) will be dismissed from the Exam and his/her results will not be declared. DISTURBANCE: One of the purposes of the Exam Center is to provide you with a quiet and undisturbed environment. Please do not speak, talk or otherwise make any other noises that would disturb other examinees. PRAGNA EXAM REGISTRATION: Before completing the registration for the Satsang Pragna Exam, please note the following points: Examinees who have passed the India Pravin Exams can appear for the Pragna 1 Exam. Examinees according to their decision can appear for both the question papers in the same year or appear for the 1st paper in the first and the 2nd paper in the following year. One can only appear for the 2nd Paper after passing the 1st Paper. Candidates opting to sit only for one out of the two papers must score 45 marks to pass. Examinee should make his/her decision during registration. Pragna examinees can choose first paper or both papers. Select the first paper if the student wishes to appear for the first paper and if he/she wishes to appear for both papers, select both papers. Examinees who have registered for both papers of Pragna Exam should give both papers. Presence in only one paper will not be considered valid. Examinee who appear for both papers in the same year must score a combined minimum of 90 marks to pass. After passing the 1st paper, one can postpone appearing for the 2nd paper for a maximum of 1 year. If two examinees are eligible for a prize then the one who has appeared for both exams together will be rewarded with 10% marks and thus become a candidate for the prize. The Satsang Examinations started with just 56 centers at its inception in 1972. Today it has exponentially grown and spread to 1550 centers globally. Thus far, 500,000 people have appeared for the annual twelve-tiered Satsang exams. The first exam, Bal Satsang-1, caters to children and over a period of twelve years ultimately culminates to Pragna-3, which is equivalent to the post-graduate level. The examinations are prepared, administered, and scored with strict academic standards and disciplines. The exams in India are held annually in July whereas in the overseas centers such as USA, Canada, UK, Europe, Far East, Australia, New Zealand, Middle East and Africa conduct the exams in March each year. The exam papers are offered in three different languages: Gujarati, Hindi and English. India: The exams are held annually on every 1st or 2nd Sunday of July. Overseas: The exams are held annually on the 1st Sunday of March. A practice pre-test for each level is posted on the site starting January that can be downloaded. After passing the Pravin Satsang exam, candidates are eligible to move forward to the Pragna Satsang exams. This postgraduate level course comprises of Pragna 1, Pragna 2 and Pragna 3. Each exam has two parts: Paper 1 and Paper 2. Candidates can appear for both papers in the same year or sit for them over two separate years - a maximum of 1 years apart. Thus, if a candidate appears for Paper 1 in year 1, and passes, he must take Paper 2 by second year. Candidates who take the Pragna Exam papers 1 & 2 separately must score a minimum of 45% in each of the papers to pass. Paper 2 can only be taken if Paper 1 has been successfully completed. Candidates who take for both papers in the same year must score a minimum total of 45% to pass. Pragna exam completion certificate is awarded when the examinee successfully completes both papers.
