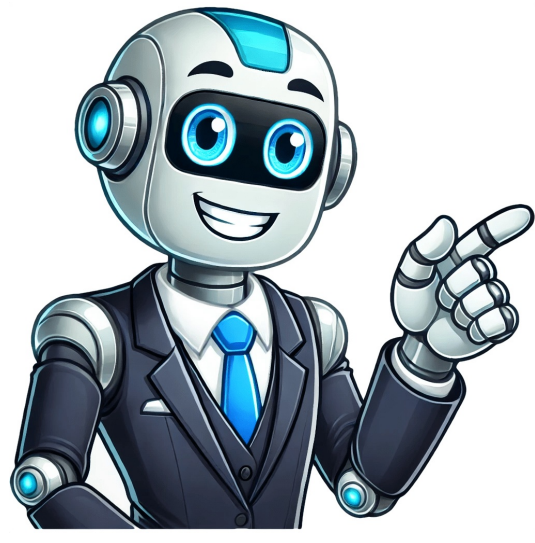

Caps, gowns, and other commencement apparel can be ordered through the NC State Stores website or during the NC State Stores Grad Fair. All regalia and commencement apparel can be purchased in-store at Wolfpack Outfitters. Distribution of caps and gowns will take place at Wolfpack Outfitters in Talley Student Union. All graduation apparel must be paid for at the time of pick-up. Students must present a photo ID (either student ID or driver's license). Bachelor's candidates wear the NC State red cap and gown. Master's degree candidates wear a black cap and gown. Bachelor's degree candidates' cap and gown sets can be ordered with a white tassel, but the tassel may be purchased separately; tassels do not come with the cap and gown sets. Bachelor's degree candidates do not wear hoods. Doctoral, Masters and DVM degree candidates do wear hoods. Each candidate is responsible for purchasing his or her personal hood, which may be purchased along with academic apparel at Wolfpack Outfitters. All undergraduate students graduating with honors have the option of purchasing an honors sash. The Academic honors are designated based on a student's cumulative GPA when entering their final semester, as final grades are not calculated until after Commencement. Additionally, if you have a guest who needs handicap-accessible seating, please let us know ASAP so that we can make arrangements. In order to secure your graduation clearance, you must: Confirm Graduation Application procedures and complete any college or school paperwork with your advisor, including completing your Graduate Plan of Work (for MSW Students only). Complete the online Graduation Application (Graduation Application Help Guide) in MyPack Portal. Confirm that you have fulfilled all requirements for your degree. If applying for a minor, speak with your Minor Advisor (for BSW students only). Once you have applied to graduate, please do the following to prepare for Graduation Day: Purchase your graduation apparel: Your robes, mortarboard and tassel can be purchased through the NC State Bookstore. Preordering is only required for special needs and those orders should be made 4 - 6 months prior to your graduation date. Photo ID is required for apparel purchases. Check your FERPA/Privacy Block settings: We can only print your name in the graduation program if you have either removed the privacy block completely or if you have a full privacy block, you allow a release for certain publications (graduation materials). If you do not remove your privacy block or allow a release for publications, we will not print your name in the graduation program, however, your name will still be called during the school graduation ceremony. Students can check their FERPA settings in Mypack Portal. Click here for information on how to remove your privacy block. 'Save' Check your name and address: Your official North Carolina State University diplomas will be mailed to the address that appears in MyPack Portal. If you have any financial holds on your account, you will not receive your diploma until they have been resolved. Diplomas will be mailed to you about a month after graduation.Your Diploma will have on it the name that you have saved as your name in MyPack Portal. Special Recognition: The School of Social Work enjoys recognizing our students for their accomplishments. Therefore, If you are a veteran, scholar, Phi Alpha or other honor society member, please have your designated representative email Daniel Corn to ensure that you your accomplishments are recognized in the graduation program. Special Access Needs: Be sure to email Daniel Corn if you or your graduation guests have any special access needs. Slideshow Photo Submission: Once graduates have removed their privacy block, they will need to send a headshot photo along with cohort photos/photos at field placements to Daniel Corn for the graduation slideshow. All photos will be screened to ensure that they are appropriate for the intended audience. If a student does not send a personal headshot photo, their student ID photo will be used. This is not an application to attend the university ceremony. Apply NC State does not publish the names of graduates who have certain privacy restrictions on their accounts. If a privacy setting exists without an exception for graduation publication, graduates names will not appear in the commencement program or other materials. Update Graduates should confirm the address to which their diploma should be sent. If no 'Diploma Address' is identified, all diplomas will be mailed to the 'Home Address' listed in MyPack Portal. Update Graduates who do not supply a diploma name will have their legal name printed on both their diploma and in the commencement program. Update Before you can be cleared to graduate, you must make sure that you have no outstanding financial obligations with the university. Loan recipients may also be required to complete an online exit interview prior to graduating.
