"Katy and Orlando have split but are amicable," a source close to the pair exclusively tells Us Weekly. "It's not contentious at the moment. Katy is of course upset but is relieved to not have to go through another divorce, as that was the worst time in her life." According to the insider, Perry, 40, and Bloom's split has been "a long time coming" as things between them "have been tense for months." (The pair, who share 4-year-old daughter Daisy, have been apart since Perry kicked off her Lifetimes tour earlier this year.) For now, Perry is "keeping busy" on tour "and is distracted," the insider shares, revealing that while on the road, the pop star is "renting out" her Westcott Estate in Montecito, California. 2025 kicked off with a slew of celebrity breakups. Two months after first sparking split rumors, Jessica Simpson announced that she and Eric Johnson had called it quits after 10 years of marriage. "Eric and I have been living separately navigating a painful situation in our marriage," she told Us Weekly in a January 13 [...] "But her and Orlando have always lived in their other Montecito home as their primary residence," the source continues, adding that the duo were "planning on making the Westcott home their family home but plans have changed" and "have been living apart since Katy has been on tour." The couple briefly split in March 2017, but were back together by February 2018. Perry and Bloom got engaged on Valentine's Day in February 2019 — and one year later, she announced in March 2020 that she was pregnant with the pair's first baby. Their daughter, Daisy Dove, arrived that August. (Bloom is also the father of son Flynn, 14, with ex-wife Miranda Kerr.) News of Perry and Bloom's breakup comes after reports of tension in their relationship. According to a second insider, the former couple's inner circle was well aware of the couple's relationship rough patch. Katy Perry and Orlando Bloom's relationship included a nude paddleboarding session, a meeting with the pop and just about everything in between before they split in June 2025. The singer and the actor dated from January 2016 to March 2017 before briefly calling it quits. They were officially back together by February 2018, and one [...] "It's an unspoken thing that they are having issues and have for a while now," the second source said. "Everyone around them knows." The second insider added that Bloom was keeping his struggles with Perry "close to the vest," but had been "out and about more often" without her while she was on her Lifetimes Tour, which kicked off in April. "Katy has been very busy working, and they are apart often," the second source told Us, "that has caused tension." Despite being engaged for six years, the second insider revealed that Perry and Bloom "never set a date for the wedding or got around to planning anything and Orlando is 'over it.' Mom and dad! Katy Perry and Orlando Bloom are officially parents and they love gushing about their little one." The actor became a father in 2011 when he and his ex-wife, Miranda Kerr, welcomed their son, Flynn. While the pair split two years later, they continue to coparent. The model's husband, Evan Spiegel, praised their [...] "Throughout their years of being in the spotlight, the couple have been forthcoming about their ups and downs, with Perry sharing via Instagram in April 2023 that they 'continuously put in the work' to maintain their relationship. As for Bloom, he explained in April 2024 how the pair's fame affected their romance: "It's a chance for any kind of evolution sometimes it feels like. Her popular singles include "I Kissed a Girl," "Last Friday Night (T.G.I.F.)," "Rear," and "Rise." Katy Hudson was raised in southern California, the middle child of two him/her parents, Christian ministers. Nonreligious music was forbidden in the Hudson household, and she grew up singing church hymns and gospel tunes. As a teenager, she learned to play the guitar and sought a musical career in Nashville with a Christian record label, but her debut album, the gospel-influenced Katy Hudson (sold poorly. By then, however, Hudson had found new musical models in such rock artists as Freddie Mercury and Alanis Morissette, whom she had discovered through friends. She soon moved to Los Angeles to pursue success in the career music realm, adopting her mother's maiden name, Perry, to avoid confusion with the actress Kate Hudson. Perry's initial efforts at mainstream stardom were fruitless, with two separate record labels signing and subsequently dropping her before any material was released. In 2007, however, Capitol Records put out Perry's EP *Ur So Gurl*, which attracted modest attention for its cheerfully flippant title track. She made a greater splash several months later with the single "I Kissed a Girl," an assertive ode to sexual curiosity backed by a hard-edged electro-pop beat. The song quickly stirred controversy, as some critics derided it for promoting same-sex relations and others charged that the racy scenario it depicted catered to male fantasies of female sexuality. 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
