This has changed on the TEAS 7. The TEAS 7 features four new question types in addition to multiple-choice: Multiple-Choice Multiple-choice questions provide four answer choices, with only one option available to select as the correct answer. In addition to text, some questions include charts, exhibits, and graphics. Multiple-Select Multiple-select questions provide four or more answer choices, and more than one answer choice may be correct. For these questions, a prompt appears, asking you to “select all that apply.” To correctly answer a question, you must select all correct answers. If you select any incorrect answer choices and/or do not select all of the correct answer choices, that question is scored as incorrect, no partial credit is given. Supply Answer Supply answer questions do not provide answer choices. Instead, the question asks you to “fill in the blank” or to simply answer the question provided. Because the exam is used purely as an evaluative tool, meant to gauge how well you'll be able to handle nursing school curriculum, what qualifies you as “passing” the exam is ultimately up to the programs you're planning to apply to.You will have access to your scores within 48 hours of your testing date. As it stands, the TEAS splits its scores into sections. Each question category has its own score, as well as the test sections themselves, alongside one big score compiled from your scores on the test sections. The Mathematics portion has 36 questions with a total time limit of 54 minutes. The Science section of the TEAS exam consists of 53 questions and takes 63 minutes to complete.
