Noises barking, mysterious screams and appearances are just some of the chances to scary famous sites such as the Amityville's house and the island of dolls. When it comes to a list of terrifying places in the world, you can count on these sites to keep you at night. Known as the "sea of trees," Aokigahara forest appearance fascinating in appearance with lush, green trees. After finding a girl drowned in a nearby canal, Barrera started dolls everywhere until her death. Some inhabitants say Barrera has done this to remove the malignant spirits. The Haunting Hill of the Crosses is actually a place of pilgrimage that exists from the 14th century. Exact origin Hill of the Crosses remains a mystery, but all its history, the Hill of the Crosses has created a lot of controversy. In 1940, the rooms held by adding crosses to the site for the rebels of honor that died for Lithuanian independence. That's exactly what life is like for residents on the island of Miyake-Jima. Their lives depend on frequently wearing gas masks because they occupy an active volcano. Now, a constant flow of poisonous gas emissions from the volcano, pushing the officials to request the premises to bring gas masks at any time. When the levels of toxic gases in the air jump, alarms blare all Miyake-Jima to warn residents to wear their masks. Bold visitors can access the island with ferry or by plane. Now, Centralia is a ghost town, and experts estimate that fire could continue to burn over 250 years. Located 200 miles from Delhi, the strong abandoned Bhangarh is located in the middle of a desert. The ship permanently anchored in Long Beach, California, and eventually transformed into a hotel and tourist attraction. As a result of these legends, countless paranormal sightings occurred at Corvin Castle. Sagada, Philippines, is home to one of the most unique burial rituals in the world. Instead of putting coffins in the ground, the people of the Sagada place hang hundreds of coffins in caves and along the rocky walls of the cliffs. It was a common practice for more than 2,000 years. Sagada's cabinets are difficult to reach, and many visitors say that others should respect the burial tradition and view the site from afar. In the 19th century, archaeologists hope to find hidden treasures, such as beautiful monuments and frescoes in Romenia's Catacombe of Santa Priscilla. Unfortunately, they discovered the catacombs have been destroyed, and the legend claims the tombs have been devastated, because the ghosts obsessed cursed cemetery. According to archaeologists, some of the remains met angry spirits, who pushed their transport to a nearby river. Outside the shore of San Francisco, California, the former military and federal prison called Alcatraz sits. From 1934 to 1963, the known plant was the house of many infamous prisoners, between Gangster Al Capone, Bumpy Johnson and George "Machine Gun" Kelly.
