It allows you to direct the pressure that is produced by the turbine. Usually, using a lower air pressure will send more massive drops of materials, making a rougher finish but with the adjustable settings from this model this is no longer a problem. With 9 different settings, it's easy to control the sprayer for various finishes and materials. For instance, if you turn the air power up and use a thicker paint, you will get a smooth finish and quick coverage. Since the dial allows you to work with various viscosity of paint, you can create a fine finish on smaller projects with lower air pressure. Feature Two Nozzles With two nozzles, the Flexio 3000 is known as an excellent piece of equipment for various materials and surfaces. The iSpray nozzle is ideal for surfaces like walls, fences, and siding since it comes with a wide spray. Relying on that, you can get quicker coverage and a smooth finish. Or if you want to regulate how to spray vertical, horizontal, narrow or wide patterns, you can do with ease. Additionally, you are able to change the nozzles by twirling the iSpray nozzle and adding another detail finish one. The second nozzle will help you apply a thin coat, leaving an even finish on any surface. So, before you do thin latex paint for a Wagner HVLP spray gun, I recommend you read... There are two types of paint: latex paints and alkyd paints. Latex paints are water-based and thicker than oil-based alkyd paints. That thickness is also referred to as viscosity, which essentially means how well your latex paint and oil paint will flow. We're going to focus on latex paint today and why it is essential to dilute your latex paint to enhance its flow and consistency. Good flow is particularly important when using a spray gun for your painting projects. If your paint is too thick, it will clog your spray gun's nozzle... and not just once but repeatedly. And it always seems to happen at the worst time, like after you just climbed a 3-story ladder or when you're in a hurry to avoid getting drying marks where you last painted. Read More >> How Does an Airless Sprayer Work? Each time your Wagner HVLP spray gun clogs it will take you 10-15 frustrating minutes to clean it out. So, do yourself a favor and thin your latex paint right the first time. On the flip side, be careful not to over-thin your latex paint. If you do, you'll end up with a runny overspray mess on your hands (and everything else.) Now, let's learn how to thin latex paint the right way... Latex paint 5-gallon bucket (or smaller if you need less paint) Wooden paint stir stick (free when you buy your paint) Cup of water (or Floetrol) Mesh filter/strainer (or cheese cloth) Funnel (optional) Check your latex paint's thickness Pour some paint into an extra bucket Add water (or Floetrol) Stir the paint and water until it passes the thickness test Pour the paint through a filter and into your Wagner spray gun Before opening your can of paint, give it a good mix for 30-60 seconds. You can do this by either shaking it with both hands or by holding the can's handle at knee height and quickly moving the handle front and back in a short motion to swing the can. That step is more important with leftover paint that's been sitting for a long time. You can probably skip that step with new paint. Either way, you'll now open the can and use your wooden paint stick. Begin by mixing the paint in a circular motion and up and down for about 10 times. The up-and-down motion helps mix any paint material that has settled at the bottom. After stirring, lift the stir stick out of the paint and note how the paint drips off of the stick. It will likely drip in one long stream initially for a few seconds and then start dripping on and off. Read More >> What Are The Top Paint Sprayers For The Walls In Your Home? That's how you know your latex paint's too thick for your paint sprayer and needs to be thinned. An alternative to watching the paint drip off of the paint stick is to pour it into a funnel and watch the paint flow. You have a preference for thinner latex paint? Then start thinning... Begin by pouring your desired amount of paint into a 5-gallon bucket or smaller. If your Wagner spray gun will pull paint directly from a bucket, then you'll probably want to use a strainer during this pour. But most people with a smaller paint sprayer just use a handheld sprayer, which is fine. Step 3 - Add water (or Floetrol) Now you'll want to mix in some water and stir. Typically, a 1/2 cup of water for every gallon of paint helps achieve the desired consistency. You can always add a little more water later, if necessary. And don't worry about adding too much water, because you can always add a little more latex paint later, if necessary. We have noticed that higher quality latex paints tend to come a little bit thicker and may need a little extra water. Some professionals prefer to use a paint conditioner, such as Floetrol, instead of water. It can give your paint job a smooth finish, but isn't critical. Floetrol is available on Amazon or in most paint stores. Step 4 - Stir the paint and water mix Stir the latex paint slowly as you add a small amount of water. Keep using the up-down-spiral movement with your stir stick, as we mentioned earlier. As you stir the mixture, pull your paint stick out every 10 seconds or so to check how well the material comes off the stick. If you need your paint thinner, just add a little more water. Once your latex paint passes your thickness test, it is much less likely to clog your HVLP paint spray gun. But let's test it to be sure... Step 5 - Pour the paint through a filter and into your Wagner spray gun Pour a small quantity of the latex paint mixture through a filter or strainer and into your airless paint sprayer. Then test spray a surface (preferably a vertical surface) to see that the spray pattern and consistency of the paint is working well. If the mixture is still too thick, you may see a little bit of an "orange peel" texture. If the mixture is too thin, your paint will make drip marks and have a long drying time. The ideal consistency is when the mixture doesn't drip and dries quickly. Then you can smile proudly, having perfectly thinned your latex paint for your HVLP Wagner spray gun. Sometimes a budget does't allow for a team of professionals to come in and complete the job either. Wagner Flexio 3000 Review Overview Wagner is a brand well regarded for their professional paint sprayers. In general, there are a few different designs of sprayers, high volume low pressure also known as HVLP, airless, and simple compressed air paint sprayers. Professional paint sprayers generally fall into the airless category, and while they are a great sprayer for the professional, for the bulk of homeowners the maintenance and cost isn't usually an option. This paint sprayer is an HVLP sprayer, meaning it falls in a great category that most users find the sweet spot of a sprayer's price point and performance. HVLP's have a pretty big range of pricing and applications as well, but Wagner features a lot of options that homeowners love. There are high-end options in this category that usually cater to the woodworking community looking for a very smooth finish. Overall HVLP's are easy to use, economical and are much quicker than the alternative of brushing and rolling paint. Additionally, there is less overspray and a smoother finish than a compressed air sprayer. HVLP's like this Wagner though are ideal for small projects like painting garage doors, sheds, fences and the like. Wagner Flexio 3000 Review Features Wagner includes two nozzles in this set as well as the X-Boost Turbine and accessories in a hard case for secure storage. The X-Boost Turbine is the portion of the sprayer that houses the motor and is powered using a cord. The X-Boost Power Dial allows the user to largely adjust the air power coming from the turbine. There are 12 speeds to provide optimum customization based on the material being used. The iSpray nozzle is larger and is designed to provide a roller like finish for projects like siding, fences or walls. This nozzle is designed to be able to use interior and exterior latex paint un-thinned for the best coverage. Material flow can be adjusted on the iSpray nozzle using the collar on the top of the gun. There is a spray width adjustment located in front of the nozzle to adjust the size of the spray pattern. The trigger on both nozzles is large and comfortable, providing comfort to the user. Upon depressing the trigger the motor will start followed by the paint flow. A Detail Finish nozzle is designed for a smoother finish, for use on cabinets and trim. As well, this nozzle is designed for thinner materials such as oil-based stains. Material flow is adjusted using the knob near the trigger of the spray gun. You can alter the spray pattern's direction by rotating the front air cap on both nozzles. Depending on horizontal and vertical pattern need. The material is drawn up through a small plastic inner tube. It is imperative while spraying upwards, such as soffits to be sure that the tube is pointing backward. The nozzles are securely connected to the turbine using a twist and lower level lock to provide security while in use. This is called a Lock-n-go design and allows for easy cleaning as well. Wagner states this gun can be cleaned in five minutes. Wagner Flexio 3000 Review Performance I want to focus first on the really great parts of this model. The design of the motor and paint container allow a better weight balance over some I have used. The ergonomics are exponentially improved, making it more comfortable than other models I have used. The controls are also extensive for a sprayer in this category, making it a good option for those who will need a sprayer for different mediums. The multiple flow and speed options are a key in getting the best quality out of your sprayer. Clean up was relatively simple, I do like the design of how the nozzle attaches to the turbine to allow for a quick detachment. I feel this also prevents potential damage to the sprayer's turbine components down the road. One of the hardest things to do with a sprayer like this is exterior latex. While it is an approved material, it is certainly the hardest of the mix. My Dad recently began a repainting project that was an ideal opportunity to test this sprayer. We used Sherwin Williams Super Paint, which is a great quality exterior paint. Overall this sprayer did an amazing job giving a great spray pattern and a very smooth finish without wasting paint. Having the ability to control flow and speed lend itself for a lot of control. One very important thing you do not want to overlook with this sprayer is its internal material draw up design. If you find yourself spraying soffits and in strange angles, paying close attention to how the inner tube is pointed will save you a lot of trouble during use. We encountered this issue a few times during use. While it was an easy fix once you realized the problem it caused some spattering and irregularities that took a bit of time to work out. I have used a sprayer from Wagner called the Power Painter that had a straw-like internal tube and allowed you to paint at virtually every angle. This model isn't advertised to do that, but for me, I appreciated that feature a lot in my other model. More than anything this issue, this is a common error, and one easily corrected once you are aware of it. The fine finish sprayer was an interesting design. Using a different nozzle and cup size it is designed for smaller projects. My first attempt with this nozzle was on a set of table legs using a water-based topcoat from General Finishes. I would say this worked well for this, I didn't have many issues and once the adjustments were made to get the best quality spray pattern, I was on easy street. I will say it is still not my favorite way to spray these smaller projects, but it worked. Clogs are quite common with paint sprayers in general and there are a lot of variables that influence the frequency and severity. Some factors include weather, type of paint, and even the occasional debris. There are a lot of ways to try and get ahead of them, but I will share a few that I had good luck with in my experience. Outside of thinning the paint, you can also strain the paint to be sure you have minimal dust and other matter interfering. This is a commonly overlooked solution and while it does take some time it will save you more in the long run. When painting in warm and sunny weather I occasionally use a household product, Glad Press'n Seal to cover the front cap to prevent the paint from drying in the nozzle. There is a lot to like about this sprayer, especially when you consider the versatility of its use in large and small-scale projects. For a homeowner needing to paint a fence, patio furniture, small sheds and the like, this sprayer is ideally suited. While you can use it for some larger projects, it will certainly save time over brushes and rollers. I wouldn't say it is the best use for a sprayer of this nature. Wagner Flexio 3000 Review Value Without a doubt, Wagner provides quality homeowner grade paint sprayers that allow a lot of customization without the high cost. This model has a price tag of \$149.00 and is available at The Home Depot. I think this is a fair price for this sprayer's versatility. Wagner Flexio 3000 Review Final Thoughts I wish I could tell you this sprayer was flawless, but I have yet to find one that quite is. I ran into a few issues with it that had easy enough fixes and with a little trial and error, this sprayer can be a great performer. Ultimately, for a homeowner looking to save some time without making a large investment into an airless unit, this model is an excellent option. Wagner combines a lot of great features into this unit, like the secondary fine finish nozzle and the extensive options in terms of the spray pattern, speed, and volume. All in all, the Wagner Flexio 3000 is a great option for a wide range of projects homeowners will encounter.
