Important: The costs listed above do not include housing, food, transportation, books, or health insurance. Students are not covered under the expenses for their projects, which can vary depending on the scale. The Form 1098-T is a statement that certifies tuition to students who are currently enrolled in the program. It's used to determine eligibility for tax credits and can be accepted by clicking IRS Publication 1098-T. Your 1098-T will be issued by January 31st, but you can also opt to receive it electronically. To receive ECFI's electronic 1098-T, please log in to ECFI's website and click on the "1098-T" link. If you have an incorrect SSN, email 1098t@nyfa.edu for help. What's the timeline for the 1098-T? The form covers January 1st to December 31st of the calendar year. Does it show if financial aid covered my tuition and fees? Yes, Box 5 on the form displays any financial aid received during the tax year. If your tuition was fully paid by aid, you won't get a Form 1098-T. If you have a notice about submitting a W-9, what's that about? The IRS requires us to notify students without a valid SSN or ITIN on how to correct or provide one. If you have a valid number, contact 1098t@nyfa.edu about the form. Will I get a Form 1098-T if I made qualified payments but withdrew from classes? Yes, only for the amount not refunded. My accountant says we must give you a 1098-T form, but that's not true according to IRS regulations. We don't have to provide one if your expenses were entirely waived or paid by a scholarship; entirely paid by a third party like an employer; you're missing a valid SSN or TIN; you're a non-resident alien and may; international students can't claim education tax credits in the U.S. Where did my 1098-T form get mailed? The IRS says it should go to your permanent address. If that's changed, update it with us so we send it there. If not, or if we don't have an active address for you, it might be sent to another active address we have on file. Charges not qualified or eligible include: late fees, housing expenses, transportation, meals, books, and family costs. The New York Film Academy's Los Angeles campus is situated in Burbank, close to top entertainment companies like Universal and Warner Bros., providing students with an immersive creative environment. Students may also participate in production workshops on the prestigious Universal Studios backlot. NYFA LA offers programs in filmmaking, acting for film, producing, screenwriting, photography, cinematography, 3D animation, documentary filmmaking, game design, and digital editing. Part-time and online options are available for students with other commitments. According to Niche rankings, NYFA Los Angeles professors put a lot of effort into teaching their classes, making it easy for students to get the classes they want. The campus is known for its low student-to-faculty ratio and affordable average cost after financial aid. NYFA LA also hosts various events and collaborations with industry professionals, such as a recent performance celebrating Latin music's influence on American culture in partnership with Carnegie Hall. NYFA Los Angeles: A Institution Divided They focus on making money from international students rather than providing a valuable education, which can be frustrating for many. The graduation experience is also marred by poorly timed screenings and the lack of a formal showcase for final thesis films. Despite having had positive interactions with people in LA, I have been disappointed with NYFA as an institution. If you're considering attending NYFA, I would recommend looking elsewhere, such as USC, AFI, or UCLA. On the other hand, NYFA Los Angeles is known for its hands-on approach to film education, making it an excellent opportunity for those interested in filmmaking. The campus is situated in the historic media district of Burbank, offering students access to Warner Brothers Studios, Walt Disney Studios, and Nickelodeon Studios. The campus features two main buildings, as well as on-campus and off-campus resources, including equipment holding areas, film and television sets, and multiple theatres. Many students also have the chance to participate in production workshops on the famous Universal Studios Backlot. With its location in the heart of Burbank, students can explore local restaurants, cafes, and attractions, making it an ideal spot for aspiring visual artists. NYFA's admissions team is committed to helping prospective students with all their questions, ensuring a smooth application process from start to finish. They offer pre-college summer programs with open enrollment, but it's pricey at \$40K per year, not including room and board. The academy does provide some financial aid, although the CEO wasn't clear on the specifics - around 20% of students receive help, with the FAFSA being a part of the process. There's a significant international presence, with about 60% of LA campus students hailing from abroad. However, only 15% of last year's graduates landed jobs in their field, and even that number might be inflated due to many contract-based roles. The program focuses on hands-on learning across various business aspects, aiming to equip students with a broad understanding and collaboration skills. Given the shift towards accessibility in filmmaking, NYFA emphasizes self-promotion for its students, whether they're actors, directors, or producers. They offer opportunities to network with industry professionals through events like pitch meetings, screenings, and guest lectures - the latter featuring notable names like Steven Spielberg and Kathleen Turner. The faculty consists of working professionals with MFAs from top film schools, ensuring a practical approach to education. The academy has national accreditation but is pursuing regional recognition as well. I met with a panel of professors, including the Chair of Acting and the Dean of Liberal Arts, who mentioned that about 30% of classes focus on liberal arts, allowing for smaller class sizes and tailored instruction based on student ability.
