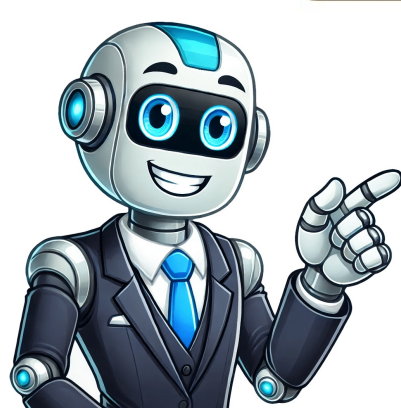


I'm not robot

It covers the same fundamental concepts as its predecessor but with more accessible content and exercises tailored for elementary learners. Each student book consists of 16 lessons that introduce numerous words derived from 40 distinct Greek and Latin roots. The lessons group these roots thematically, making it easier for students to understand their connections. The series presents each lesson's vocabulary in dictionary format, including pronunciation guides, definitions, and example sentences showcasing correct usage. To reinforce understanding, the lessons incorporate a range of exercises such as matching, fill-in-the-blank, multiple-choice questions, and sentence completion activities. A review lesson follows every three lessons to consolidate learning, featuring additional exercises to solidify students' grasp of the material. The student books do not include answers, but there are separate answer keys available for each book. The teacher's guides offer comprehensive support with lesson plans, oral activities, written assignments, and strategies for effective vocabulary instruction, even for teachers without a background in classical languages. Test books provide multiple-choice questions for each lesson, along with reproducible tests for more flexibility. This series offers an affordable and efficient way to introduce younger students to crucial Greek and Latin roots that underpin the English language. To unlock the full potential of this educational series, it's essential to have JavaScript enabled or use a browser capable of running JavaScript. However, in this case, the sum is significantly more than its individual parts due to the comprehensive approach taken. By studying the core Latin and Greek roots, students' vocabularies expand far beyond the 240 words presented, as these roots serve as the foundation for numerous additional terms. The series organizes roots into thematic worktexts, with each of the sixteen lessons in every book introducing up to 15 words derived from two or more classical roots. Each lesson commences with a "root dictionary" that showcases the root and its forms in bold type, accompanied by English words derived from that root. The English words are presented in dictionary format, featuring pronunciation keys, definitions, word forms, and example sentences demonstrating correct usage. Throughout each lesson, students engage with various exercises, including synonym and antonym identification, analogies, vocabulary-in-context activities, and sentence completion, ensuring mastery of the material. Additionally, literary, historical, and geographical references aim to increase students' cultural literacy. To reinforce learning, creative or expository writing assignments are suggested every two lessons, allowing students to apply their knowledge in a practical setting. The Answer Key provides answers to exercises, while the Teacher Key offers valuable support, including tips for individualized learning, blackline masters, and additional review activities and vocabulary games. Test Booklets with answers are also available, featuring a single non-reproducible test and a more expensive version suitable for classroom or home use in Grades 4, 5, and 6. This educational series provides exceptional value, making it an excellent resource for parents who may not have had the opportunity to study classical languages in school.
