users, the DashPass subscription offers free delivery on orders over \$12 and reduced service fees for \$9.99/month or \$96/year. The total cost varies based on factors like location and demand. Yes, some restaurants on DoorDash might increase their food prices compared to in-store rates to cover DoorDash's commission fees and other costs. However, DoorDash encourages consistent pricing across platforms to maintain customer satisfaction and is spotlighting restaurants that keep steady pricing. The DoorDash app is free to download and use, with an optional subscription service discussed later. Its pricing includes food costs, order and delivery fees (including surge or small order fees), and an optional driver tip. On the app or website, you can browse local restaurants, each displaying its delivery fee which varies based on distance. Restaurants set their own menu prices, which may match or exceed in-store prices. When you select your food, your cart displays the total cost, service fee, and delivery fee. The first part of DoorDash's pricing is the delivery fees. Luckily, DoorDash makes the delivery fees super transparent. They pop up under the restaurant's name when browsing through the app or website. This means you'll know how much you're going to be paying for delivery before you've even chosen your food! The delivery fees are calculated based on distance and demand; for example, how far you are from the restaurant, and how busy it is for Dashers (DoorDash's delivery drivers) at the moment. You'll find that restaurants closest to you will be a lot cheaper than ones that are further away. The closer the restaurant, the less distance your Dasher will have to travel! Delivery fees can also go up and down quite quickly. If you've ever used the app at around 5 p.m., you'll notice that the fees jump in price. This is because more people are browsing the app and placing orders. Sometimes you'll also notice that DoorDash won't charge any delivery fees. This is either due to promotions or because it's a quiet period. Delivery fees are generally anywhere between \$0.99 and \$5.99, but they can go a lot higher if you're far away from the restaurant. DoorDash splits the delivery fee between themselves and the Dasher. Higher delivery fees help compensate the Dashers for traveling longer distances. Every DoorDash order includes a delivery fee, typically ranging between \$0.99 and \$5.99. This cost can vary based on the restaurant and demand. During peak hours, typically from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. to 9 p.m., these fees might increase due to high demand. After the delivery fees come the service fees. This is calculated based on the total cost of your order, starting at \$0.60. The service fee varies based on several factors, such as the size of your order. The more food you order, the higher your delivery fee will be! Generally, the service fee will be a percentage of the order cost. A common amount is around 15% of the order total, but this can increase due to other factors. The service fee helps DoorDash cover things like marketing, technology development, and payment processing. They help keep DoorDash running so you can get the most out of the service. The service fee can be annoying, but it is unfortunately mandatory. While delivery fees can be sometimes waived, service fees rarely are. The service fee, usually around ten percent of the order's subtotal, can vary based on the customer's location and demand. Within the DoorDash app, the "fee and estimated tax" section provides a breakdown of this fee. It's rare to find discounts on this fee, as always factor it in when placing an order. DoorDash sometimes charges extra fees on top of service and delivery. This is most commonly surge pricing, which is where prices change due to increased demand. This fee gets spread across your food and delivery fees, so sometimes you might not even notice it! Surge pricing only takes effect during busy parts of the day (for example, during lunch times or the dinner rush). The prices change because there's higher demand and less availability. This makes it more competitive for Dashers, who are always seeking the highest-paying orders. One way you can avoid surge fees is by ordering during off-peak times, such as in the afternoon or early morning. The least busy times of day will mean cheaper fees all around. However, if you really can't afford to order during these times, another tip is to close out of the app and wait a bit. Sometimes the prices might go down after five to ten minutes. So, if you don't mind waiting longer, this can be a good way to get cheaper fees on your order. DoorDash implements surge pricing during busy periods like lunch or dinner times, leading to higher overall costs due to increased demand. You can avoid these surge fees by ordering during off-peak times or by waiting a few minutes before placing your order, as prices may decrease. The other extra fee DoorDash charges only applies to small orders. A small order is usually classified as an order under \$15. You'll be charged an extra \$2.50 on top of your order cost. This gets added to make the trip worth it for Dashers, who would otherwise not accept a small order. This fee is separate from the pre-existing service and delivery fee. It gets listed as "Small Order Fee" below the other costs. One way you can avoid this fee is by simply ordering more food. Try adding a side dish or a drink to your order to bump it over \$15! DoorDash enforces a minimum subtotal, generally between \$8 and \$10, depending on the city. If your order falls short of this amount, a small order fee of about \$2 is charged. It's often more economical to add an additional food item, like an appetizer or drink, to reach the minimum and avoid this fee. You also have the option of adding a tip for your Dasher. You can either do this while checking out or immediately after the delivery. Tipping is suggested to help support your driver. While tips aren't mandatory, they can be a great way to reward your Dasher for their hard work. You might consider adding a tip if your Dasher goes above and beyond to deliver your order, or if they correctly follow tricky delivery instructions. A standard-sized tip is around 10 - 20% of the total order cost. You also have the option of adding a simple tip amount, such as \$1 or \$3. DoorDash doesn't keep any of the tips; it goes straight to the driver. While tips are an annoying extra, they are a nice way of thanking your Dasher. Without delivery drivers, you wouldn't have your food in the first place! Your checkout page will list a "Taxes & Fees" charge, comprising the local sales tax and the service fee. This is still needed to pay sales tax regardless of what type of order you're placing. To see the exact breakdown of how much you're being charged in taxes and fees, you can tap the info next to the charge on your checkout page. There are a few other costs to consider outside of DoorDash's standard fees. There are optional fees to be aware of, such as the Express Fee. This is the fee that you get when using Express Delivery on checkout, and it's usually only a few extra dollars. You essentially pay more for faster delivery. There are also other fees associated with DoorDash's operating costs, such as Regulatory Response Fees. You'll encounter these sometimes when DoorDash's operating costs increase due to local or state regulations. It might not be fun for you, but it helps DoorDash pay its drivers while still providing the service you want. You can see a breakdown of the fees you were charged on your receipt after the order has been completed. If you think you might've been charged too much, you can always try to request a refund with DoorDash! Suppose you are craving a burrito. First, you would search through the DoorDash app for a restaurant that offers the food you like. After adding all of the items you'd like to eat into your cart, you will see the total listed and a breakdown of the fees described above. DoorDash might also notify you that you failed to meet the order minimum, which would add a small fee. While the cost of the fees associated with DoorDash can add up, the company works to offset those costs through promotions and subscriptions. Our Take: Is DoorDash Worth It? Food delivery can get incredibly expensive once the markups, fees, and tips have been included. Oftentimes, the order can nearly double - just with the added costs. However, we still think DoorDash is worth it. At the end of the day, users are paying for convenience. But, that convenience is going to cost money. After all, somebody else is physically driving to pick up - and then drop off - your order to see that you don't have to. I always ask myself if the convenience is worth the tradeoff. If it's not? Target Grocery Delivery Service? I didn't add a number to this one as part of the list because it's essentially the same as Shipt. Target has partnered with Shipt (the company actually bought Shipt back in 2018) to offer same day delivery service not only on groceries but for most items in the store. Same day delivery? Yes. Free shipping? Free on orders over \$35, \$9.99 on anything else. Membership required? Yes, but you can try it with a 2-week free trial. Allows coupons? No, but they do feature weekly in-store sales and exclusive discounts for members. Delivery from local stores? Yes. By the way, if you are already a Shipt member, make sure your email address is the same as your Target account's email. They will then automatically link the two. What About Meal Kit Delivery Services? Meal Kit delivery services have exploded in the last few years, but that is a totally different category of services. Companies like Home Chef, Hello Fresh and Blue Apron don't necessarily deliver groceries for you. I mean, technically they do since they deliver all the ingredients you need to make your meal but you can't give them a list of groceries and expect them to deliver it for you. So based on the fact that they are not technically a grocery delivery service, I didn't include them in this post. That said, keep an eye out as I am working on a list of the best meal kit delivery services like Hello Fresh and Blue Apron. FAQ About Grocery Delivery Services. At the end of the day, I think whether or not using a grocery delivery service is worth the cost for you depends on your individual situation.
